ECONOMIC PERFORMANCE

- GDP growth is projected at 4.5% in 2018, on the back of agriculture (10.7%), mining (6.1%), electricity (28.5%), distribution, hotels and restaurants at (7.3%);
- In 2017, inflation is anticipated to average 3% and is projected to hover around 3.01% in 2018.
- Total revenues for 2018 are projected at US\$5.07 billion comprising of : -
 - US\$4.3 billion relates to tax revenue;
 - US\$237.2 million is accounted for by non-tax revenue;
 - US\$434.0 million retained revenue; and
 - US\$100 million grants.
- Total expenditures for 2018 are projected at US\$5.74 billion with main expenditures comprising of: -
 - Employment Costs US\$3.27 billion; and
 - Capital expenditure US\$1. 16 billion, translating, to 5.51% GDP.

- The 2018 Budget Framework will result in a reduced budget deficit of US\$675.8 million by year end.
- Debt stock projected at US\$14.4 billion as at 31 December 2017, which is 74.4% of GDP.

- Support to Hospitals and Health Centres US\$86.9 million;
- Provision of Maternal and Child Health Care US\$10.2 million;

- Support to tertiary Institutions including new state universities-US\$48 million;
- Provision of teaching and learning materials at the Basic Education level US\$43.5 million;

- Support to learners with special needs-US\$3.5 million;

TAX PROPOSALS

Support to Industry

- Extension of rebate of duty facilities to various sectors and duty free importation of additional raw materials in order to enhance competitiveness of the local industry.
- 150% allowable deduction on expenditure related to technical and support services availed to smallholder farmers as well as expenditure incurred by manufacturing companies that sub-contract production of goods to small and medium enterprises.
- Exemption of power generation projects from Corporate Income Tax for the first 5 years, and a Corporate Income Tax rate of 15% thereafter.
- Ring-fencing of US\$5 million from presumptive taxes for the formalisation of traders and vendors and on-lending to Small and Medium Enterprises.

Revenue Enhancing Measures

- Introduction of staggered export tax rates on un-beneficiated minerals.
- Introduction of 5% levy on gross takings by bookmakers.
- Disallowance of input VAT component from deductions allowable in the determination of taxable income.

Relief Measures

- Amnesty on interest and penalties on outstanding taxes accrued prior to 1
 December 2017 where tax obligations are settled within 6 months.
- Review of the VAT withholding rate from 10% to 5% of the value of taxable supplies.
- VAT exemption on meat of goat and sheep.
- Review of capital allowances on expenditure incurred by holders of Special Mining Leases in the construction of staff housing, hospitals and schools.
- Repeal of interest on unpaid penalties.
